Gorski on the 4th Step

(From *Understanding the Twelve Steps*)

The First Step teaches alcoholics that they are chemically dependent and that addictive use is destroying their lives. The Second Step teaches them that they lack the expert knowledge and the strength to solve the problem of addiction by themselves. The Third Step shows them that there is a source of courage, strength, and hope and a body of technical know-how that can show them the way out. Now they are ready for Step Four, learning how to take an inventory of current strengths and weaknesses.

It is frightening to take an honest look at yourself, perhaps for the first time in your life. Doing an inventory takes courage because you discover things about yourself that you don't want to know. Taking a Fourth Step inventory is a lot like shining a bright light into a cave. When you turn on the light, you can see all sorts of scary things crawling around inside.

A good Fourth Step is "searching." It challenges you to look at all aspects of yourself. It shows you that you are a fallible human being with strengths and weaknesses and that in order to recovery, you must decide what you are bringing with you on your road to recovery so that you can build on your strengths and your weaknesses. Gorski makes five basic points about the Fourth Step which are as follows:

- You recognize the need to complete a personal inventory of both strengths and weaknesses (character defects).

- You recognize and overcome the denial and excuses that blocked you from completing this inventory.

- You select a knowledgeable and experienced person (an A.A. sponsor, spiritual adviser, or counselor) to assist

- You develop a list of questions about your strengths and weaknesses to be used in completing the inventory.

- You complete the inventory by writing a list of your strengths and weaknesses.

Many psychologists hate the words "character defects" because they get paid to call them "personality problems," but they are talking about the same thing. A character defect is a personality problem that is composed of automatic irrational thoughts, unmanageable feelings, and self-defeating behaviors.

Character defects operate on five levels. Level one is *situational*. Into what situation does the nature of your problem force you? The second level is *behavioral*. What behavior is your character defect driving you to do? The third level is *thinking*. What irrational thoughts are being created by the character defect? The fourth level is *feeling*. What unmanageable feelings and emotions are being created? The fifth level is belief—the *core mistaken belief*. This is the basic character defect that fuels the whole problem. "What is the fundamental mistaken belief at the core of your value system that's driving you to behave in this manner?" it is the core mistaken beliefs for which you search in a thorough Fourth Step inventory."

Tradition 4: From the Bottom Up

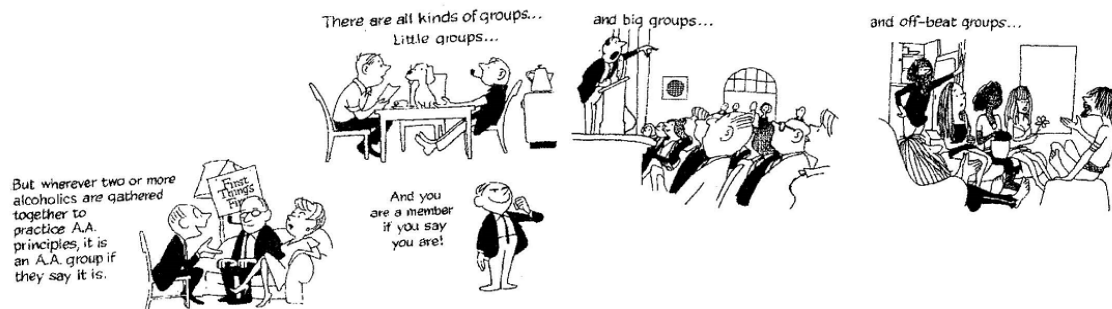
How change really happens

This morning, as I was reading the book Thank You for Sharing--Sixty Years of Letters to the A.A. Grapevine, I came across letters in a section regarding a story about the Lord's Prayer in A.A. meetings. As I read from letter to letter, each opinion voicing valid concerns and viewpoints from both sides of the issue, it occurred to me that there may be no better reason for A.A. members to learn the Traditions and our service structure, and how they allow us to operate, than this topic. It is virtually as old as our Fellowship itself, and returns as regularly as clock-work.

Personally, I have never felt the need to argue about whether or not the Lord's Prayer belongs in AA meetings, because I know that the Fourth Tradition tells me that "Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole." Therefore, I know it's the group's choice to recite this prayer and not some proclamation that came down from on high.

But change in AA does not occur from the top down, and a letter to the General Service Office in New York is not a letter to the "powers that be." Besides, regardless of how much or how well we write, all GSO staff is going to do is reply that they support the group's autonomy and they leave the decision where it belongs, in the hands of the individual members. AA's service structure is inverted, and any changes in AA come from the Fellowship and from the groups themselves.

In other words, we can write all the letters we want, but if we don't like something that is 'going on in our A.A. meetings, regularly attending group business



meetings is one way to begin changing it. Once in the business meeting, we begin to see how the group functions, how our Traditions work, and how the service structure ticks. Reading the pamphlet "The A.A. Group" will give a better idea about how everything meshes.

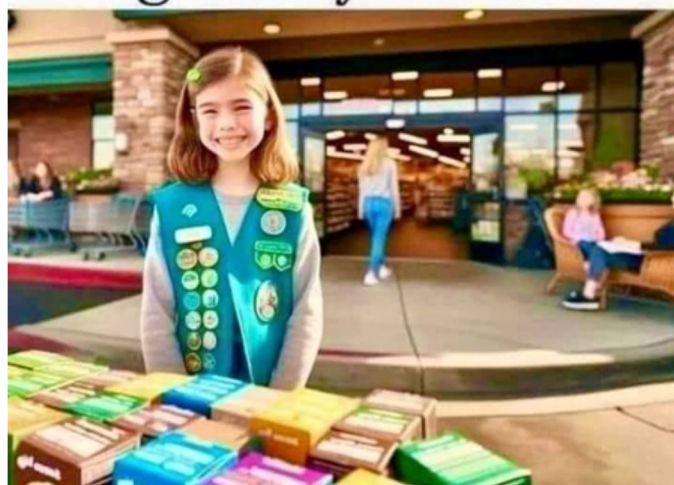
If we feel strongly about a topic, we can bring it up in the business meeting. A motion may or may not get passed. But one thing is for sure, we'll see where the power in AA rests: on the shoulders of each member who feels strongly about a topic and seeks to change or defend it. We'll also be less likely to be drawn into arguments about it again, too. Safe in the knowledge of how change really happens in AA, we might sit back, listen to the new person's impassioned pleas, and ask, "So, why don't you attend the business meeting next week if you feel that strongly about it?"

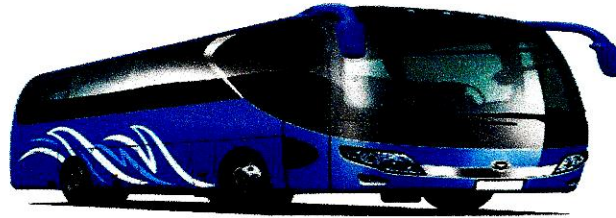

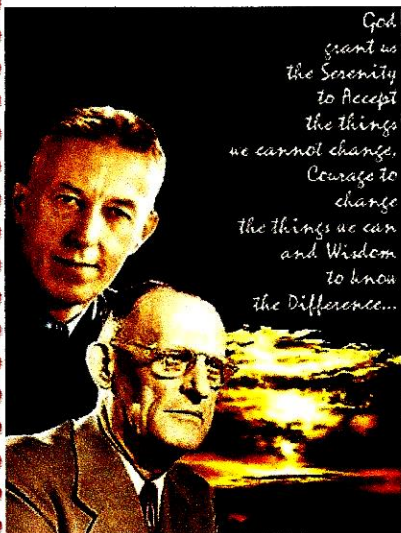
